Vision Teams

Recently, we received questions around "best practice" for vision teams or established leadership teams who want to support BIST in the building. The BIST Model is a framework requiring on-going discussion and evaluation to maintain energy, fidelity of implementation and to truly change children's lives. Please use the information below to evaluate your current vision team/leadership team or to help establish this team to support your building in the future.

Purpose

- Building experts meet regarding the BIST Philosophy and consistently assess the building
- All members of this team should be adept in writing student plans for success, processing with students, and triage (increasing life skills)
- The team sets 1-3 goals for the building, moving the building forward by increasing teacher/building strategies and capacity of changing students
- The team models how to outlast students through relationship and restriction while teaching the Goals for Life

Meetings

- This team meets monthly for approximately 30 minutes
- Each grade level is represented, as well as specials teachers, additional support staff and administrator
- Meeting agenda is determined by the administrator, vision team or BIST Consultant (Team may utilize BIST Consultant notes from visit as focus area)
- Logistics: A team member facilitates meeting, an agenda may be utilized and a team member takes notes during meeting to be emailed to staff
- Focus: Review predetermined building goal(s) each meeting, discuss focus area/concern for that month and solutions

Team Member Responsibilities

- Communicate with represented colleagues
- Assess their building area
- Communicate with administrator regarding building concerns
- Communicate with BIST Consultant regarding building concerns
- Visit a school site to network with other vision teams

• Attend BIST Vision Team Conference annually (April)

Questions to enhance Vision Team Problem-solving

- 1. We discuss how the building is teaching and protecting students during vision team meetings. Y / N
- 2. We discuss where our building is on balancing Grace & Accountability during vision team meetings. Y/N
- 3. We have a plan to consistently communicate information to parents. Y/N
- 4. We have a formalized way to communicate BIST concerns with our administrator. Y / N
- 5. We have a plan for the building regarding BIST training needs. Y/N
- 6. We have a plan to attend the Vision Team Conference in April. Y/N
- 7. We consistently evaluate whether our building is maintaining students or changing students. Y / N
- 8. All vision team members are confident that they can create an effective student plan for success. Y / N
- 9. All vision team members are confident that they can create an effective skill-based triage script. Y / N
- 10. All vision team members are meeting with a student to triage daily. Y / N
- 11. We have discussed how to set up accountability coaches for the building. Y / N
